
Messiah Comes from a Twisted Family Tree

Matthew 1:1-ff: A record of the genealogy of Jesus Christ the son of David, the son of Abraham:

2 Abraham was the father of Isaac, Isaac the father of Jacob, Jacob the father of Judah and his brothers, 3 Judah the father of Perez and Zerah, whose mother was Tamar (NIV)

Matthew 1:5-ff: 5 Salmon the father of Boaz, whose mother was Rahab (NIV)

Matthew 1:5-ff: Boaz the father of Obed, whose mother was Ruth, Obed the father of Jesse, and Jesse the father of King David. (NIV)



Peter's Pentecost Sermon

Acts 2:29-31: "Brothers, I can tell you confidently that the patriarch David died and was buried, and his tomb is here to this day. But God raised him from the dead, freeing him from the agony of death, because it was impossible for death to keep its hold on him. (NIV)

Acts 2:30-31: But he (David) was a prophet and knew that God had promised him on oath that he would place one of his descendants on his throne.


Isaiah saw Jesus

John 12:37-43: Even after Jesus had performed so many signs in their presence, they still would not believe in him. 38 This was to fulfill the word of Isaiah the prophet: "Lord, who has believed our message and to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed?" NIV)

John 12:39-ff For this reason they could not believe, because, as Isaiah says elsewhere: 40 "He has blinded their eyes and hardened their hearts, so they can neither see with their eyes, nor understand with their hearts, nor turn—and I would heal them."

Isaiah said this because he saw Jesus' glory and spoke about him. (NIV)

Did they know? They did know!

Genesis 16:7 (Hagar flees from Sarai)

"You are the God who sees me." (16:13)

Genesis 18 (the three "visitors" to Abraham)

two are angels and one is the Lord
Sarah will have a son
Abraham pleads for Sodom

Genesis 32 (Jacob wrestles with God)

"I will not let you go until you bless me."

Peniel = "I saw God face to face and yet my life was spared"

Judges 2:1-5 (the people at Bokim) 6:11-12,14 (Gideon) 13:3,6,8-11,15-17,20-23 (Manoah and his wife – Samson's parents)

Exodus 3:2,4 (the burning bush)

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appeared to him in flames of fire from within a bush. Moses saw that though the bush was on fire it did not burn up. 3So Moses thought, "I will go over and see this strange sight-why the bush does not burn up." (NIV)

Exodus 3:4-ff: When the Lord saw that he had gone over to look, God called to him from within the bush, "Moses! Moses!" And Moses said, "Here I am."

5"Do not come any closer," <u>God said</u>. "Take off your sandals, for the place where you are standing is <u>holy ground</u>." (NIV)

Exodus 3:6: Then he said, "I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob." At this, Moses hid his face, because he was afraid to look at God. (NIV)

Exodus 3:7-ff: The Lord said, "I have indeed seen the misery of my people in Egypt. I have heard them crying out because of their slave drivers, and I am concerned about their suffering.

8So I have <u>come down</u> to rescue them from the hand of the Egyptians and to <u>bring them up out</u> of that land into a good and spacious land, a land flowing with milk and honey (NIV)

I, that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?"

12And God said, "I will be with you. And this will be the sign to you that it is I who have sent you:

When you have brought the people out of Egypt, you will worship God on this mountain." (NIV)

Exodus 3:13-ff: Moses said to God, "Suppose I go to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' Then what shall I tell them?"

14God said to Moses, "I am who I <u>am</u>. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: 'I <u>AM</u> has sent me to you.' " (NIV)
