the "unholy trinity" (the Devil, the world, sinful flesh)





Message of the Prophets

Leviticus Sanctification/Holiness Themes

to set apart, chose, make holy, cleanse, purify, wash, bring out and bring in, adoption into the family of God, the Triune God working IN and THROUGH His people

Exodus 31:13: "Say to the Israelites, 'You must observe my Sabbaths. This will be a sign between me and you for the generations to come, so you may know that I am the Lord, who makes you holy. (NIV)

made holy (active work of God) "receiving the holiness of Jesus" (passive)

Evening and Morning Shabbat (Sabbath) Pesach (Passover) Unleavened Bread Firstfruits Shavuot (Weeks/Pentecost) Rosh Hashanah (Trumpets) Yom Kippur (Day of Atonement) Sukkot (Booths/Tabernacles)

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The Apostle Paul

Colossians 2:16-17: Therefore do not let anyone judge you by what you eat or drink, or with regard to a religious festival, a New Moon celebration or a Sabbath day. (NIV)

Colossians 2:16-17: These are a shadow of the things that were to come; the reality, however, is found in Christ. (NIV)

Leviticus 1 – List of Sacrifices

the burnt, sin, guilt offering the grain, drink, thank, first fruits, tithes the fellowship offering

<u>atoning</u> (God and sinners reconciled) forgives and takes away sin

thanksgiving (once reconciled – in response) offer up thanks, gratitude and praise

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Shadows and Reality Jesus, the Lamb of God

Scripture Interprets Scripture

John 1:29: The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him and said, "Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world! (NIV)

Romans 3:20-ff Therefore no one will be declared righteous in his sight by observing the law; rather, through the law we become conscious of sin. 21 But now a righteousness from God, apart from law, has been made known, to which the Law and the Prophets testify. (NIV)

Romans 3:20-ff: 22This <u>righteousness from God</u> comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. There is no difference, 23for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God ...

Romans 3:20-ff: 24 and are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus. 25 God presented him as a sacrifice of atonement, through faith in his blood. (NIV)

Hebrews 10:11-12: <u>Day after day</u> every priest stands and performs his religious duties; <u>again</u> and <u>again</u> he offers the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins. 12But when <u>this priest</u> had <u>offered for all time one sacrifice for sins</u>, he sat down at the right hand of God. (NIV)

<u>atoning</u> (God and sinners reconciled) forgives and takes away sin

thanksgiving (once reconciled – in response) offer up thanks, gratitude and praise

Hebrews 13:11-15: 11The high priest <u>carries the</u> <u>blood</u> of animals <u>into the Most Holy Place</u> as a sin offering, but the bodies are burned outside the camp. 12And so Jesus also suffered outside the city gate <u>to make the people holy</u> through his own blood. (NIV)

Hebrews 13:15: Through Jesus, therefore, let us continually offer to God a sacrifice of praise--the fruit of lips that confess his name. (NIV)

High Priest

Leviticus and Hebrews

sacrifices and priests shadow and reality

Jesus is both the ... Priest and the Sacrifice

Not from Levi BUT Melchizedek Psalm 110

Hebrews 7:21 ... but he (Jesus) became a priest with an oath when God said to him: "The Lord has sworn and will not change his mind: 'You are a priest forever.' " (NIV)

Hebrews 7:22: Because of this oath, Jesus has become the guarantee of a better covenant. (NIV)

"better" NOT God's NEW plan "better" = the reality of the shadows Hebrews 7:23-ff: Now there have been many of those priests, since death prevented them from continuing in office; 24but because Jesus lives forever, he has a permanent priesthood. (NIV)

many priests = live, die, another priest Jesus = permanent priesthood Hebrews 7:25: Therefore he is able to save completely those who come to God through him, because he always lives to intercede for them.

(NIV)

permanent and perfect priesthood forever lives to pray for us

Romans 8:26-ff

Hebrews 7:26 Such a high priest meets our need--one who is holy, blameless, pure, set apart from sinners, exalted above the heavens. NIV

Unlike others ... Jesus is the Perfect Priest

Hebrews 7:27: <u>Unlike the other high priests</u>, he does not need to offer sacrifices day after day, first for his own sins, and then for the sins of the people. He sacrificed for their sins <u>once for all</u> when he offered himself. (NIV)

no sacrifice for His own sin sacrifice for our sin ... once for all

Hebrews 7:28. For the law appoints as high priests men who are weak; but the oath, which came after the law, appointed the Son, who has been made perfect forever.

Hebrews 1:3: The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven. (NIV)

"this priest SAT down"

the work is finished – sacrifice <u>made and accepted</u> then the sacrificial gifts (works of Jesus) are given we continually receive Hebrews 4:14-16: Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has gone through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold firmly to the faith we profess. NIV

Hebrews 4:14-16 For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are--yet was without sin.

Hebrews 4:16. Let us then approach the throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need. (NIV)

Day of Atonement and the Temple Curtain

One of the Themes of the Scripture

Sin <u>Separates</u>
Jesus Brings Us Near

Isaiah 59:2: But your iniquities have separated you from your God; your sins have hidden his face from you, so that he will not hear. (NIV)

#1 rebellious = prodigals

run away from God and run to/toward other gods

leave home and the Father unfaithful to the Husband

#2 "unclean, unclean" separated from God and one another

in the presence of holiness

Isaiah ... a man of unclean lips and
a people of unclean lips

Sin Separates Jesus Brings Us Near

cleansed, made holy, brought near

Day of Atonement

Holy Place and entrance into the Most Holy Place

Leviticus 16:2. The Lord said to Moses: "Tell your brother Aaron <u>not to come whenever he chooses</u> into the Most Holy Place <u>behind the curtain</u> in <u>front of the atonement cover on the ark, or else he will die</u>, because I appear in the cloud over the atonement cover. (NIV)

Leviticus 23:27-28: "The tenth day of this seventh month is the <u>Day of Atonement</u>. Hold a sacred assembly and deny yourselves, and present an offering made to the Lord by fire. 28Do no work on that day, because it is the Day of Atonement, when atonement is made for you before the Lord your God. (NIV)

Atonement =

sins confessed sins forgiven and sins taken away God and sinners reconciled peace with God

Shadows and Reality

the sacrifices, the Atonement, the Tabernacle Holy of Holies and even the Curtain

Scripture Interprets Scripture

Hebrews 10:19-23: Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the Most Holy Place by the blood of Jesus (NIV)

entrance into the presence of God by the Blood of Jesus

Hebrews 10:19-23: 20 by a new and living way opened for us through the curtain, that is, his body, (NIV)

"the curtain" torn in two from top to bottom

Mark 15: 37-38: With a loud cry, Jesus breathed his last. 38 The <u>curtain of the temple was torn in</u> two from top to bottom. (NIV)

"the curtain" torn in two from top to bottom

Hebrews 10:21-22 ...and since we have a great priest over the house of God, 22let us draw near to God with a sincere heart in full assurance of faith, (NIV)

cleansed/made holy draw near to God

Hebrews 10:21-22 ... having our hearts sprinkled to <u>cleanse us from a guilty conscience</u> and having our bodies washed with pure water. (NIV)

cleansed – basin for washing baptism

Covenant Language

Hebrews 10:23: Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. (NIV)

God makes and keeps His promises in Jesus

Hebrews 2:14-ff Since the children have flesh and blood, he too shared in their humanity so that by his death he might destroy him who holds the power of death--that is, the devil-- 15and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by their fear of death.

(NIV)

Hebrews 2:17-ff: 17 For this reason he had to be made like his brothers in every way, in order that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in service to God, and that he might make atonement for the sins of the people. (NIV)

(participate in)

Passover Lamb Red Sea, Sinai, Wilderness, Promised Land Water, Bread, Light the Tabernacle

"sinners and saints" <u>wandering</u> in the wilderness as the Triune God <u>leads them</u> to the Promised Land

The Triune God Blesses Numbers 6:23-27

Numbers 6:22-27: The Lord said to Moses, "Tell Aaron and his sons, 'This is how you are to bless the Israelites. Say to them:

"'"The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face shine upon you and be gracious to you; the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace."

27"So they will put my name on the Israelites, and I will bless them." (NIV)

The People Grumble, Complain, and Rebel

the golden calf (Exodus 32)
"back to Egypt" (Numbers 11)
the report of the 12 spies (Num. 13)
wandering for 40 years
Korah's rebellion (Num. 16)
the bronze serpent (Num. 21)

Numbers 11:4-6: The rabble with them began to crave other food, and again the Israelites started wailing and said, "If only we had meat to eat! 5We remember the fish we ate in Egypt at no cost-also the cucumbers, melons, leeks, onions and garlic. 6But now we have lost our appetite; we never see anything but this manna!" (NIV)

Numbers 20:2-5: Now there was no water for the community, and the people gathered in opposition to Moses and Aaron. They quarreled with Moses and said, "If only we had died when our brothers fell dead before the Lord!

(NIV)

Numbers 20:2-5: <u>4Why did you bring</u> the Lord 's community into this desert, that we and our livestock should die here? <u>Why did you bring us up</u> out of Egypt to this terrible place? It has no grain or figs, grapevines or pomegranates. And there is no water to drink!" (NIV)

Numbers 21:4-9: They traveled from Mount Hor along the route to the Red Sea, to go around Edom. But the people grew impatient on the way; 5they spoke against God and against Moses, and said ... (NIV)

Numbers 21:5-6: "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the desert? There is no bread! There is no water! And we detest this miserable food!" 6Then the Lord sent venomous snakes among them; they bit the people and many Israelites died. (NIV)

Numbers 21:7-9: The people came to Moses and said, "We sinned when we spoke against the Lord and against you. Pray that the Lord will take the snakes away from us." So Moses prayed for the people. (NIV)

Numbers 21:8-9: The Lord said to Moses, "Make a snake and put it up on a pole; anyone who is bitten can look at it and live."

9So Moses made a bronze snake and put it up on a pole. Then when anyone was bitten by a snake and looked at the bronze snake, he lived. (NIV)

Just as ...

So also ...

John 3:14-15: <u>Just as Moses lifted up the</u> snake in the wilderness, <u>so</u> the Son of Man must be lifted up, 15 that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him. (NIV)

Deuteronomy 6

Shema
"Hear, O Israel ...

Deuteronomy 6:3-ff: Hear, O Israel, and be careful to obey so that it may go well with you and that you may increase greatly in a land flowing with milk and honey, just as the Lord, the God of your fathers, promised you. (NIV)

Deuteronomy 6:4-ff: Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. 5Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. (NIV)

Deuteronomy 6:4-ff: These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. 71mpress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. 8Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. 9Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates. (NIV)

Matthew 22:35-40: One of them, an expert in the law, tested him with this question: 36"Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" (NIV)

Matthew 22:35-40: Jesus replied: " 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' 38This is the <u>first</u> and greatest commandment. (NIV)

Matthew 22:39-40: And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'

40All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments." (NIV)

The Gospel of Matthew fulfill them = "fill them to the full"

"Do not think that I have come to <u>abolish the Law or</u> the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but <u>to fulfill them</u>." (Matthew 5:17 NIV)

Jesus is the fulfillment of the Law

not abolished but filled to the full

the Law Giver the Perfect Law Keeper

2 Corinthians 5:21: God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. (NIV)

A Prophet like Moses

Moses to the People of Israel before they enter the Promised Land

Deuteronomy 18:15-18: The Lord your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among your own brothers. You must listen to him. (NIV)

Deuteronomy 18:18: I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their brothers; I will put my words in his mouth, and he will tell them everything I command him. (NIV)

Who is THE "Prophet"?

John 1:19-21: Now this was John's testimony when the Jews of Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to ask him who he was. (NIV)

John 1:20-21: He did not fail to confess, but confessed freely, "I am not the Christ. "
21They asked him, "Then who are you? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not."

(NIV)

John1:21: "Are you the Prophet?" He answered, "No." (NIV)

John1:21: 22Finally they said, "Who are you? Give us an answer to take back to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?"

23John replied in the words of Isaiah the prophet, "I am the voice of one calling in the desert, 'Make straight the way for the Lord.' "
(NIV)

The Voice From Heaven

"This is My Son!
Listen to Him!"
(Baptism and Transfiguration)

Matthew 17:3-ff: Just then there appeared before them Moses and Elijah, talking with Jesus. (NIV)

Luke = talking about his "exodus"

Matthew 17:3-ff: ... a bright cloud enveloped them, and a voice from the cloud said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased.

<u>Listen to him!</u>" (NIV)

Psalm 2, Isaiah 42 and Deuteronomy 18

Stephen

Acts 7:37-39: "This is that Moses who told the Israelites, 'God will send you a prophet like me from your own people.' 38He was in the assembly in the desert, with the angel who spoke to him on Mount Sinai, and with our fathers ... (NIV)

Acts 7:37-39: ... and he received living words to pass on to us. 39"But our fathers refused to obey him. Instead, they rejected him and in their hearts turned back to Egypt. (NIV)
