Deuteronomy

(a Covenant <u>renewal and affirmation</u> before entering the Promised Land)

Deuteronomy 6

Shema
"Hear, O Israel ...

Deuteronomy 6:3-ff: Hear, O Israel, and be careful to obey so that it may go well with you and that you may increase greatly in a land flowing with milk and honey, just as the Lord, the God of your fathers, promised you. (NIV)

Deuteronomy 6:4-ff: Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. 5Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. (NIV)

Deuteronomy 6:4-ff: These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. 71mpress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. 8Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. 9Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates. (NIV)

Matthew 22:35-40: One of them, an expert in the law, tested him with this question: 36"Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" (NIV)

Matthew 22:35-40: Jesus replied: " 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' 38This is the <u>first</u> and greatest commandment. (NIV)

Matthew 22:39-40: And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'

40All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments." (NIV)

The Gospel of Matthew fulfill them = "fill them to the full"

"Do not think that I have come to <u>abolish the Law or</u> the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but <u>to fulfill them</u>." (Matthew 5:17 NIV)

Jesus is the fulfillment of the Law

not abolished but filled to the full

The Great Exchange

2 Corinthians 5:21: God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. (NIV)

A Prophet like Moses

Moses to the People of Israel before they enter the Promised Land

Deuteronomy 18:15-18: The Lord your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among your own brothers. You must listen to him. (NIV)

Deuteronomy 18:18: I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their brothers; I will put my words in his mouth, and he will tell them everything I command him. (NIV)

Who is THE "Prophet"?

John 1:19-21: Now this was John's testimony when the Jews of Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to ask him who he was. (NIV)

John 1:20-21: He did not fail to confess, but confessed freely, "I am not the Christ. "
21They asked him, "Then who are you? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not."

(NIV)

John1:21: "Are you the Prophet?" He answered, "No." (NIV)

John1:21: 22Finally they said, "Who are you? Give us an answer to take back to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?"

23John replied in the words of Isaiah the prophet, "I am the voice of one calling in the desert, 'Make straight the way for the Lord.' "

"Why is this happening to us?"
"This is why! ... You have broken the covenant!

Repent!"

Jeremiah 11:10-11: They have returned to the sins of their forefathers, who refused to listen to my words. They have followed other gods to serve them. Both the house of Israel and the house of Judah have broken the covenant I made with their forefathers. (NIV)

Jeremiah 11:11: Therefore this is what the Lord says: 'I will bring on them a disaster they cannot escape. Although they cry out to me, I will not listen to them. (NIV)

"You have broken the covenant!"

Isaiah 7:14

Matthew 1:21-23: She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."

Isaiah 42:1-4: "Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom I delight; I will put my Spirit on him and he will bring justice to the nations. 2He will not shout or cry out, or raise his voice in the streets. (NIV)

Isaiah 42:1-4: 3 A bruised reed he will not break, and a smoldering wick he will not snuff out. In faithfulness he will bring forth justice; 4he will not falter or be discouraged till he establishes justice on earth. In his law the islands will put their hope." (NIV)

Isaiah 52:13-ff: See, my servant will act wisely; he will be raised and lifted up and highly exalted.

14Just as there were many who were appalled at him - his appearance was so disfigured beyond that of any man and his form marred beyond human likeness- (NIV)

Isaiah 52:13-ff: ... so will he sprinkle many nations, and kings will shut their mouths because of him. For what they were not told, they will see, and what they have not heard, they will understand. (NIV)

Matthew 20:25-ff: Jesus called them together and said, "You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them. 26 Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant ... (NIV)

Matthew 20:25-ff: ... and whoever wants to be first must be your slave, 28just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." (NIV)

Isaiah 53:3-ff: 3He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows, and familiar with suffering. Like one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not.

(NIV)

Isaiah 53:3-ff: 4 Surely he took up our infirmities and carried our sorrows, yet we considered him stricken by God, smitten by him, and afflicted.

(NIV)

Isaiah 53:3-ff: 5 But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by his wounds we are healed. (NIV)

Jesus in Nazareth Goes to the Synagogue on the Sabbath

Luke 4

Luke 4:16-17: He went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, and on the Sabbath day he went into the synagogue, as was his custom. (NIV)

Luke 4:16-17: And he stood up to read. The scroll of the prophet Isaiah was handed to him. Unrolling it, he found the place where it is written: (NIV)

Isaiah 61

"The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to release the oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." (NIV)

Luke 4:20-21: Then he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant and sat down. The eyes of everyone in the synagogue were fastened on him, and he began by saying to them, "Today this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing." (NIV)

John:18:33-ff: Pilate then went back inside the palace, summoned Jesus and asked him, "Are you the king of the Jews?" (NIV)

John:18:36-ff: Jesus said, "My kingdom is not of this world. If it were, my servants would fight to prevent my arrest by the Jews. But now my kingdom is from another place." (NIV)

John:18:37-ff: "You are a king, then!" said Pilate.
Jesus answered, "You are right in saying I am a king. In fact, for this reason I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth.

Everyone on the side of truth listens to me."

(NIV)

Acts 2:32-ff: God has raised this Jesus to life, and we are all witnesses of the fact.

33Exalted to the right hand of God, he has received from the Father the promised Holy

Spirit and has poured out what you now see and hear. (NIV)

Ascension = Coronation

defeated sin, death and the devil forever rules and reigns all things under His feet

Luke 24:44-48: 45 Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures. (NIV)

Luke 24:44-48: 46 He told them, "This is what is written: The Christ will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, 47 and repentance and forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. 48 You are witnesses of these things. (NIV)

Psalms - Messiah Praying

Hebrews 5:7: 7 During the days of Jesus' life on earth, he offered up prayers and petitions with loud cries and tears to the one who could save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. (NIV)

Mark 14:34: 34"My soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death," he said to them. "Stay here and keep watch." (NIV)

Mark 14:35-ff: 35 Going a little farther, he fell to the ground and prayed that if possible the hour might pass from him. (NIV)

Mark 14:35-ff: 36"Abba, Father," he said, "everything is possible for you. Take this cup from me. Yet not what I will, but what you will." (NIV)

Psalm 40:6-8: Sacrifice and offering you did not desire, but my ears you have pierced,; burnt offerings and sin offerings you did not require. (NIV)

Psalm 40:6-8: 7Then I said, "Here I am, I have come- it is written about me in the scroll.




